**1. Joshua A. Vorhis, age 32, of 1382 Ithaca Rd., Willseyville, NY**

Arrested on 8/3/12 at 10:45 AM for 3 counts of aggravated unlicensed operation 2<sup>nd</sup>, falsely reporting an incident, unregistered motor vehicle, uninsured motor vehicle, leaving the scene of a property damage motor vehicle accident, and moved from lane unsafely.

These charges resulted from a motor vehicle accident where Vorhis was the operator and left the scene. Vorhis reported his car was stolen. Vorhis was arraigned before Justice Gary Dence, Town of Candor Court, and was remanded to the Tioga County Jail on \$500 bail or \$1,000 bond and is to reappear before Justice Dence on 8/6/12.

**2. Clarence M. Saxton, age 52, of 370 State Route 96, Owego, NY**

Arrested on 8/3/12 at 7:57 AM for Criminal Contempt 1<sup>st</sup>.

This charge resulted from Saxton violating an order of protection issued out of the town of Tioga Court. Saxton was arraigned before Justice Paul Martin, Town of Tioga Court, and was remanded to the Tioga County Jail on \$750 bail or \$1,500 bond. Saxton is to reappear before Justice Paul Martin on 8/15/12.

**3. Harry R. Johnson Jr., age 37, of 4 Valley St., Binghamton, NY**

Arrested on 8/3/12 at 1:30 PM for Petit Larceny.

This charge resulted from Johnson taking some scrap metal, from a Newark Valley resident, and turned it in for money at Weitsman's in Owego. Johnson was issued an appearance ticket to appear before Justice John Schaffer, Town of Newark Valley Court, and is to reappear before Justice Schaffer on 9/27/12.

**4. The Tioga County Sheriff's Office investigated a motor vehicle accident on 8/4/12 at 11:03 AM in the town of Newark Valley. A vehicle operated by Gilbert Alexander, age 84, of 51 Old Stage Coach Rd., Newark Valley, entered the roadway from the parking lot of the Rite Aid and struck a vehicle operated by 63 year old Daniel Goodrich of Vestal. Alexander was ticketed with failed to yield the right of way.**
